Letter From the Director

Many students went above and beyond rehearsals, even taking additional voice lessons with Assistant Music Director Ryan McCann. While our new auditorium is amazing, its extended construction timeline meant students had to rehearse in the lobby, classrooms, and cafeteria. Their flexibility and commitment have been truly admirable.

Our stage crew also deserves special recognition for their tireless efforts in bringing this production to life in a short timeframe. Mr. Gaetano and his engineering classes contributed by building new set pieces that beautifully complement the stage. A huge thank you goes to Assistant Director and Costume Designer Nell White, who overcame significant challenges when a rental company withdrew due to budget constraints. She took on the remarkable task of sourcing and creating every costume you see on stage, including Olaf and Sven, alongside her talented team in the Innovation Lab. And as always, I am continually impressed by Music Director Samuel Porter, who guides our student musicians to perform with professionalism and finesse.

It truly takes a village to produce a musical, and that includes wonderful audience members like you who come out to support our students. Thank you for being here and for being part of this special moment.

Queen Iduna

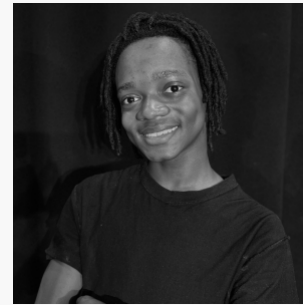

('28) Liwia is very excited to be a part of the Lodi High School's production of "Frozen" this year. This is her second year being in drama club but her first year performing on stage.

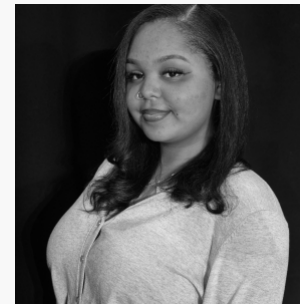

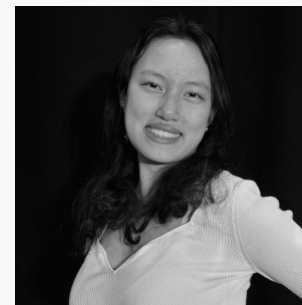

('26) Sydney is very excited to be performing in Lodi's High School's production of FROZEN. This is her second and last year of performing in the Lodi High School theater.

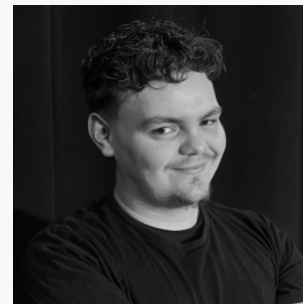
